 when we were married during her natural life and then to be
 Equally divided between her two Children Nancy & Elizabeth
 Then I leave to my beloved wife all my property Real
 and personal during her natural life or widowhood first
 paying my just debts out of I property and if she should
 pay none with child then the I property to be hers during
 her life or widowhood and then to the child and if
 she should not have with child the property
 I leave to be equally divided between my children

 Estate During her life and at her death to be equally divided
 among all my children at the discretion of my Executors I do
 hereby disannul all other Wills and Testaments I have made
 if I have hereunto set my hand this the ninth day of February
 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
 Eighty Eight signed sealed published and pronounced before
 by the said William Davis as his last will and testament in
 the presence of us who in his presence & in presence of each
 of them have hereunto subscribed our names

Robert Boole's Will

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In the name of God Amen this twenty first day of July 1798
 Robert Boole of the County of Moore and State of North Carolina
 Being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and
 memory thanks be given to God for the same therefore
 calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that
 it is appointed for all men once to die do make and co-
 sider this my last will and testament that is to say first
 -ipally and first of all I give and recommend my soul
 into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body
 I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian
 burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting
 but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
 by the mighty power of God and as touching such
 worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
 me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same
 in the following manner and form
 First I give and bequeath unto Mary my beloved wife a bed
 and furniture with other necessaries fit for house keeping that
 she shall possess so long as she shall live and after decease
 that the said property shall fall to the part of my son Robert
 but my will should be that she should still continue to
 live with my son Robert and that she should continue to
 hold the before mentioned property and also that she should
 be supported by him as long as she shall live or at least
 continue to live with him but at her decease that it
 all fall to him again I give and bequeath unto Sarah
 my daughter one cow or the value thereof And the Child-
 ren and the Wives of my two deceased Daughters (to wit)
 Mary and Esther to each of these Children leave the
 sum of one Dollar again I give to my son Robert
 Boole whom I likewise constitute make and
 Ordain my sole Executor of this my last will and
 Testament all and singular my Cattle goods household
