First ~~I~~ give and bequeath to my beloved daughters Margaret, Rachel, Shanny, Ginney Joyner two tracts of land one lying on the north side of Tar River called the Lewis tract having due regard to my deeds and grants the other lying on the north side of the rappony road joining Drewry Joiner and others having due regard to my deeds and grants containing 84 acres and one other tract called the Marshal land lying on the south side of the Great branch containing 100 acres be the same more or less having due regard to my deeds and grants to them and their heirs forever.

Item: ~~I~~ give and bequeath unto my beloved son Stephen Joiner one tract of land where ~~I~~ now live containing two hundred acres be the same more or less having due regard to my deeds and grants, one still one horse of his own choice. Also one cow and calf one bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

Item: ~~I~~ give and bequeath to my beloved grandson Lewis Daughtridge one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf to him his life time and if he should die before he comes to the years of twenty one what ~~I~~ have given to him shall be equally divided between my four daughters named in the will all the residue of my property in house and out doors to be equally divided to all the heirs named in the will, and ~~I~~ do hereby ordain my worthy son Moses Joiner executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof ~~I~~ hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

In The Name of God Amen. I David Daniel of Nash County and State of North Carolina, being in firm in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament in manner following viz:

First I lend to my beloved wife Magdalen Daniel during her life all my house hold and kitchen furniture, one horse, two cows and calves, two cows and their pigs, my working tools of every description, all my cooper ware my stock of bees, poultry of all kinds, fifty pounds of coffee, one hundred pounds of brown sugar, five hundred pounds of bacon, ten bushels of wheat, fifty barrels of corn, two hundred pounds of seed cotton, wool and flax on hand, two ewes and their lambs, one cart and wheels, one yoke of oxen, my saddle and shot gun, all to be of her choice, and at her death to be disposed of as is hereinafter provided. I also lend to my beloved wife Magdalen Daniel during her life one negro man named Samuel, one negro boy named Simon, and one negro woman named Anica and Milley, the above negroes at the death of my wife to be disposed of as is hereinafter provided.

I also lend to my beloved wife Magdalen Daniel during her life one tract of land on which I now live called the Isham Hines tract, containing and bounded agreeably to the deeds of the same; and at her death I devise the said tract of land to my son Isham Daniel and his heirs forever.

Item: I devise to my son Isham Daniel the tract of land whereon he now lives called the Cordal Hunter tract, containing and bounded agreeably to the deeds of the same to him and his heirs forever.

I also give and bequeath to my son Isham Daniel at the death of my wife the negro boy lent to her during her life by the name of Simon to
