Item: I give and bequeath to my son James Rogers the manner plantation whereon I now live also a tract of two hundred and fifty acres lying above the said manner tract also one negre body called Frank also three mares and gray mair called Ginn and two other mairs from by the name of the Cain mare and Black horse called litefoot also one third of the cattle, sheep and hoggs and one third of the tools that I have of all sorts also one third of my household furniume and one rifell gun.

Item: I give and bequeath to my two daughters Moore and Morning two negre garls Lyndia and Rose also two horse colts belonging to the Cain mairs and if either of the two sisters Moore and Mourning should decease in her nunage or with out heir her leagacys to return to the other sister,

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Patiance Rogers a negro woman called Mell after the delivery of the child that she is now to be with anothe said child after delivered to my daughter Uny Rogers also I give to my daughter Patience Rogers one mair called Bonnga.

Item: My will is that all the stock of all kinds that I have given shall not be sold but kept for the use of the children.

Item: I lend to my daughter Ann Chapman one negro woman called fillis in during her life her death to her daughter Mary Chapman.

Item: I leave all the remainder of my estate to given to be sold at the discretion of my executor hearafter named and the money to be put to the use of paisen the five youngest children.
