

In The Name of God, Amen, I Arthur Arrington of the county of Nash and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this writing as and for my last will and testament in manner and form as follows.

viz: Imprimis: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary, one negro woman called old Sary two feather beds and furniture, one sorrel mair, one Huntin saddle and bridle and two cows and calf to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I lend the use of my plantation and all the lands I possess to my beloved wife during her life or widowhood and at her death or day of marriage I give the same to be equally divided between my three sons namely Henry, Richard and Arthur but in case my wife should dye or Marry before my sun Arthur arrives to the years of twenty one then my will and desire is that my land and plantation be rented out at the discretion of my Extrs. hereafter mentioned until such time as my suns Arthur arrives to the age of twenty one and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided among my three above mentioned sons and in case these of my three above mentioned sons should dye before they arrive to the age of twenty one leaving no lawful issue then I give the same to the Survivor or survivors of them their heirs and assigns forever

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Henry one negro boy named James one feather bed and furniture to be delivered to him by my exels, when he arrives to years of twenty one but it is to be remembered that I lend the use of them to my beloved wife until that time to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Richard one negro boy named Jacob one feather bed and furniture to be delivered to him by my extrs when he arrives to the years of twenty one, but it is to be remembered that I lend the use of them to my beloved wife until that time, to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and to my daughter Elizabeth Vick, two negroes that I bought of John Battle which Henry Vick has at this time in possession namely Tiller and Will to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give to Polly ^{Hunter} my daughter one negro girl named Amy to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give to my daughter Ann one negro girl named Charvey one feather bed and furniture one chest and forty spanish Milled Dollars to be paid her ^{to when she is twenty one or marries to her,} her heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I lend the use of my negro man Ned to my beloved wife during her natural life and at her death I give him to my son Arthur. I also give to my said son Arthur one feather bed and furniture to him his heirs and

assigns forever.

Item: I lend to my beloved wife mary all the rest of my estate of what
~~or maridge my will and desire is That I give~~
 kind soever during her widowhood and and at her death to my son Joseph
 two hundred dollars also I give to my son William two hundred Dollars and
 to my son Peter two hundred dollars I also give to my two granddaughters
 Maryand Elizabeth Battle sixty Dollars each and if one should die the survivor
 to receive the hole one hundred and twenty dollars which money is to be
 raised out of that part of my estate that I lent to my wife ~~during her marriage~~
 during her widowhood to them ~~the survivor~~ their heirs and assigns forever.
 and all the remainder part of my estate I leave to be equally divided
 among my ten children namely Elizabeth, Joseph, John, William, Peter, Mary,
 Ann, Henry, Richard, and Arthur to them their heirs and assigns forever and
 I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary, three
 sons, Joseph, John and William whole and sole executors of this my last
 will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 23 day of May Anno Dom 1795.

 bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.
