Item: First I lend to my beloved wife Mary Taylor the land and plantation whereon I now live beginning on the north side of Tarriven at a ciprus nearly against the mouth of the two pole branch and from thence nearly a north course to a pine on the straight path against the head of the short branch thence nearly the same course to a pine in the back line against the head of the pecoson thence west to a red cak my own cornerthence south 154 poles to my old line thence west a long said old line to Tar river thence the midriver to the said Reginning containing four hundred scres bethe same more or less also two negroes one named Jack the other named luce and one feather bed and furniture and seventy five dollars to buy her a horse and cix come and calves of her own choice and ten shorts andthres sows and eixteen pigs and one hunting saddle and one pine chest called her own and one loom and gear and two iron pots and books and three dishos and three basens and twelve plates and twelve spoons to my said wife during her life or widowhood. Item: I pive and bequeath my loving daughter Zilpha Brantley five shillings sterling to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to mybeloved son Miles Taylor two hundred and fifty acres ofland joining Henry Adkinson line it being the land west of theland aforesaid be the same more or less due regard being to my arents and deed, and four negroes one named patience and one named Also and one named Sarah and one named Amos and one feather bed and furniture and one cew and three heifers andone hundred pounds virginia currency in money to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved son William Taylor three hundred and fifty acres of land on the east and of the first tract aforesaid due regard being given to my grants and deeds and three negroes one named Lidd andene named Isaac andene named Black Pegg and one feather bed and furniture and one cow and three heifers to him andhie heis

Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Tempy Taylor three negroes one named Mary andone named licey and one named Slvey and one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. Itom: I give and bequeath to my beloved son Merry Taylor all the land and possessions that I have lent to my wife during her life or widowhood and three negroes one named Ag and one named Dave and one named Yellow Pegg and further more my Will and desire is that my personal property that I have lent to my beloved wife during her life or widowhood the

land only excepted shall be equally divided after her time isout shall be equally divided between my children as followeth that is an equal proportion between Miles Taylor and William Taylor and Tempey Taylor and Merry Taylor to themand their heirs forever, and Thereby make andordain my worthey friends my wife Mary Taylor and WilsonTaylor Junr. of this my last willand testament in witness whereof I the said Christopher Taylor have to this my last will and testament set myhand and seal the day and year above written.
