Item: I leave my three negroes to be sold namely, Benjamin, Minney and Marget on a credit of nine months and one still and the money arising from the sale of said negroes and still to be equally divided between Margy Cardner, John Mercer, Sally Williamson, Mancy Mercer and Abby Mercer to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I leave all of the property that Thave lent to my wife to be sold at the decease of said wifeor marriage and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided between my heirs. I allso leave all of the ballance of my roperty that is not before willed away to be sold and after my just debts is maid out of the last mentioned property if there is any minney left I leave it to be equally divided between my lawful heirs and I dehereby, naminate and appoint my my worthy friends I Leace Williamson and John Mercer my hole and sole secutors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I havehereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
