Thirdly, Should I die before I foreclose a Mortgage that I now hold against G. R. C. Winslow for one Thousand dollars it is my will and desire that the proceeds of said Mortgage be equally divided between my two grand children Mary E. Clark and D. W. Winslow to have and to hold to them in fee simple forever.

Fourthly, I will and bequeath to my grand daughter Emma Winslow the sum of Fifty dollars to her and to hold to her in fee simple forever.

Fifthly, I will and bequeath to my wife Eliza Edwards the sum of Fifty dollars in money together with one good bed and furniture to her and to hold to her in fee simple forever.

Sixthly, It is my will and desire that my Executors shall sell all my property not hereby willed away and pay all my just debts and the expenses of any funeral expenses between my wife and three children.

Seventhly, I hereby do hereby constitute and appoint my Son W. P. Winslow and John D. Wells my lawful executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof. hereby making and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, in witness whereof, I the wife D. W. Winslow do hereunto set my hand and seal, This the 2nd day of April 1878.
