Item I do will and bequeath to my grand daughter Maria Weinstead the sum of fifty dollars to have and to hold to her in fee simple forever.

Item I do will and bequeath to Miss Eliza Edwards the sum of fifty dollars in money together with one good bed and furniture to have and to hold to her in fee simple forever.

Item I do will and desire that my Executors shall sell all my property not hereby Will'd away and pay all my just debts and the expenses of any decedent equally between my wife and three children.

Item I do hereby constitute and appoint Executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof. Truly testifying and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, in witness whereof I the said D. W. Weinstead do hereunto set my hand and seal, this the 2nd day of April 1878.
