I likewise constitute and ordain my wellbeloved wife the soul executor and John Bissett executor <sup>To this my last will and testament and I do hereby</sup> by utterly disallow revoke and disanull all and every form and testament wills, legacies bequests and executors by me in any ways before named will and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this 28th day of February one thousand eighty and six.
