I give to Anna, Elizabeth Richardson and Agnes. I give to Peter Richardson four girl children an bed quilt each, which I call my every day quilt. I give to Elizabeth Pettaford my black clock clock and an white earthen Bowl. I give to Nancy Pettaford an white earthen Bowl. I give to Nancy Richardson an over coat. I give to Margaret Richardson in behalf of my entire estate of whatsoever it may consist of after taking out the above named devices etc and paying my just debts & burial expenses.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trustee friends to execute this my last will and testament James Richardson and Margaret Richardson his wife according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof. hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. I William W. Warren of the County of Stark and State aforesaid being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make ordain and declare this paper writing to be my last will and testament in manuscript form as follows:

Item 1 It is my will and desire that all my just debts if any shall be paid out of the first money that shall come into the hands of my executors out of or part of my estate.

Item 2 I leave to my wife Adeline Wearall my property both real and personal for the term of her natural life.

Item 3 I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Lucy A. M. Williams now wife of Anderson H. Williams, after the death of my wife an tract of land being a part of my home tract bounded as follows Beginning at a stake at the corner of the first W.W. Warren corner in the line of J.H. Rockley's line and running N. 2^o E. 89 poles to the corner of lot No 2, thence after devide to Robert J. Wear all Thomas C. 88¹/4 W. 116¹/4 poles to a small black gum in the Rudy branch, thence down said branch to a large black gum therein S. 88¹/4 E. 14 poles to the beginning containing 34 acres more or less to her and her heirs in fee simple forever.

Item 4 I give, bequeath and devise to my son Robert J. Wear all, after the death of my wife an tract of land being a part of my home tract bounded as follows Beginning at the corner of lot No 1 herein before given to my daughter Lucy A. M. Williams and running N. 88¹/4 E. 116¹/4 poles to a small black gum on the Rudy branch thence up said branch to an oak at James J. Weary corner in the branch thereon S. 88¹/4 E. 78 poles to a stake at the head of the first pond James J. Weary corner therein C. 5^o E. along James J. Weary line 11 poles to a stake at the corner of the lot thence after devide to my daughter Adeline Stark also R. Wear all in James J. Weary line therein S. 88¹/4 E. 52 poles to a corner therein S. 2^o E. 45 poles to the beginning containing 33 acres more or less to him and his heirs in fee simple forever.

Item 5 I give bequeath and devise to my daughter
