I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth two herses, vizP my Rone horse, and spotted horse that I got of my sen W.F. Drake and two choice mules . Item: I lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth the following negrees to wit. Fed. Byrd, Ferry and Curren also Alley and her three youngest children say Mary, Jame and Baldy, also Caroline and Mary with hertwo youngest children say Maridy and Robert the foregoing named negrees I lend tomy beloved wife during her natural life or widowhood.

Item: I lendto my beloved wife all my stock ofhorces cattle, hogs, and sheep except my blooded horses, I also lend to my wife all my household and kitchen furniture. Item: I wish my blooded horses sold viz: my bridle mane and calt and two stud horses wid the proceeds to be applied to mayment of my just debte exc.

Item: At my wifes death I wish all my negroes, and other property in this state sold to thehighest bidder, but no person is to be allowed to bid for or purchase any of my negroes inthis state except my children or sons in law so that the negroes be kept in the family. Item: After my death I wish all thenegroes belonging to me in the State of Georgia to be sold to the highest bidder, free for any person to bid.

Item: It is to be understood and it is my wish that the balance of negroes I own in this state beside those I loan to my wife shall be sold after my death under the regulations and restrictions above specified.

Item: I give to my daughter Dorothy Drake one negro girl named Bilvey over and above an equal share of my property.

Item: Be it understood that my deceased son say Grandshildren draw or share a childs part.

Item: My wish is that Guardians of my children that are now manors be and shall be authorized to bid for their respective wards.

Stems My wish is that myproperty be equally divided between all my children except Dorothy she to have the negro girl Sylvy extra as above named and I also exclude my son Wm. F Drake, from any share or part of my property in this state which may be and is to be sold previous to my wife death, but at my wifes death he share with my other children what property may be left at her death.

Item: It is to be understood that each legatee account for such projecty as I may have given or loaned when making a devision.

Item: I nominate and appoint my beloved wife and my two sens in law vis: Hichelses W. Arrington and Thomas W. Wright executors to this my last will and testament. Made this 23rd day of July 1838
