Item: I lend to my beloved wife Mourning duringher natural life, all the lands I bought of Henry Drake William Parker, and the Summer land on Cae south side of the little creek. I also lend her all the household and kitchen furniture belonging to and in use where I now reside with the exception of the pianno forte and six beds and furniture. I also lend to wife Mourning all the tools and plantation—utenties belonging to this plantation.

Item: I lend to my beloved wife Mourning Hilliard, during her natural life thefollowing negroes viz: Drake, Lewis, Alsey, lydia, and child Leander, house Aggey andher three children, Frank, David and Soe, Frince Little Lewis, Renda, Old Hannah, William, Little Abram, Dice and fix children, Spencer, Baldy, Nick, George, and Anderson and Jeremiah also the still that is now set up here, with all the cider cask and my carriage and harness.
