In The Name of God Amen I John Evins of Nash County and State of North Carolina being weak of body but in perfect mind and memory blessed be God, do this twenty fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

First; I lend to my beloved wife Ann Evins one third of my land that lies above the road during her natural life and at her death to go to my son Isaac as hereafter directed. I also give and bequeath to my said wife, one negro man named Charles, one cow and calf, one work steer one barren cow thirteen head of hogs two head of sheep, one feather bed and furniture and all my part of the crop and fifty dollars in money to be held and enjoyed by her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give to my son Sherrod Evins two silver dollars in money to be held and enjoyed by him and his heirs for ever.

Item: I give to my son George Evins one negro girl charity one bay horse that he had now in possession fifty silver dollars in money, one cow and calf one barren cow and heifer two head of sheep, one rifle gun on chest, one feather bed and furniture, to be held and enjoyed by him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to my son Abraham Evins all my lands lying below the road adjoining Burwell Joiners land two silver Dollars in money to be held and enjoyed by him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to my son Isaac Evins all my lands lying above the road two thirds to be his at my death and the other third at the death of my wife, Ann evins one grey mare two cows and calves, two head of sheep one feather bed and furniture and one saddle and bridle to be held and enjoyed by him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Tempy Winstaed two silver dollars in money to be held and enjoyed by her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give to my daughter Ann Evins one negro woman named Dilce one negro boy named Lewis son of Dilce one Balck mare one hunting saddle one
