That is to say First. That my executor (hereafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses to gather with my just debts now due and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys of my estate. Item 1st I lend unto my beloved wife Charity Ann Vick during her natural life or widowhood all my property real and personal and mixed of what nature or kind soever and whensoever the same shall be at the time of my death. Item after the death of my wife Charity Ann Vick or her widowhood ceases I give to my ^{beloved} brother Jesse W. Vick one hundred and forty acres of land to be cut of from the North part of my tract of land including all improvements and all my personal property mixed of what nature or kind soever and whensoever the same shall be at the death or widowhood of my wife ceases with exception of one feather bed and furniture. Item 3rd I give and leave to my beloved old daughter Sarah J. Morris one feather bed and furniture and fifty four and one quarter acres of land to be cut of from the lands where I now live to have and to hold to her and to her heirs in fee simple for ever. Item 4th I give and bequeath unto Mother Sarah Ann Vick five

dollars to be paid by my executor out of the moneys belonging to my estate. Item 5th I give and bequeath to my two brothers and one sister (namely) David D. Vick, Zack P. Vick and Martha E. Vick one dollar each to be paid by my executor out of the funds of my estate. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty Brother Jesse W. Vick my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and parcel thereof hereby writing and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made in witness whereof I the said John N. Vick do hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of November 1880
