Stone my lawfull executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last-will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby making and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made and in writing other of & the said Jonathan M. Stone do hereunto set my hand and seal this the 14th day of March A.D. 1877.
