shall come into his hands as part of my estate.

Item 2nd I leave to my wife Nancy H. Sinsky during her
lifetime or widowhood all my property of every description
after my just-debts are paid. Item 3rd I give and devise
to my son John E. Sinsky after the death or marriage of my
wife Nancy H. Sinsky one-half of the tract of land upon
which I now live. To laid off as to include the dwelling
house and out-houses when he does live, and
at her death I give and bequeath the same to my two sons
John E. Sinsky and Haywood H. Sinsky.

Item 4th I give and devise to my Son Haywood H. Sinsky,
upon the death or marriage of my wife Nancy H. Sinsky,
one-half of the tract of land upon which I now live. to laid
off as to include the dwelling house and out-houses when
I now live. Item 5th It is my will and desire that after
the death or marriage of my wife Nancy H. Sinsky all
of the personal property bound to her shall be equally
divided amongst my lawful heirs. Item 6th I hereby make
constitute and appoint my friend Eliza H. Costello my
Executor to this my last-will and testament to execute the
