Item: I give and bequeath to my loving wife one womans saddle to her and her heirs forever.

I also leave my negro man Jack to be sold and my debts be paid with the money arising from the sale of him if any ballance over that to be equally divided between my two sons Willis Whitfield and Mathew Whitfield to go to my two sons also all the money due me ~~into~~ my death.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Willis one Dollar to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my three daughters Sarah Bryant, Chloe Dick Nancy Massengill all the property that I have lent to my wife at the end of her widowhood and all the residue of my estate that I have not all ready given away and that to be sold and equally divided amongst my three daughters. I also constitute and appoint my loving wife and my friend Sam Westray my sole and hole executors to this my last will and testament in witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 21st day of May 1798

Whereas, I Lewis Vick of the State of North Carolina and County of Nash being weak of body tho of common memory thanks be to God, do make and ordain this writing as and for my last will and testament Imprimis: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Achsah Vick one feather bed and furniture now called her bed, Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Vick the plantation whereon I now live with all the land I purchased of Hartwell Hartland Thomas Hart for the use of the Mill Reference to deeds taken by me from Hartwell and Thomas Hart containing by estimation one hundred and fifty one acres to hold to him and his heirs forever. I also give to my son son Jacob Vick paying into the hands of each of each of my daughters Namely Achsah Vick, Elender Vick and Mary Vick the sum of fifty dollars I give and bequeath unto him the said Jacob Vick the lands I purchased of David Daniel containing by estimation one hundred acres reference to a deed of sale, But on his non compliance My will and desire

is that the said lands purchased of David Daniel be equally devidid between my three daughters above named Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Vick one bay horse called Dick also one feather bed and furniture called his bed also my shoot gun. Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elender Vick one feather bed and furniture called her bed. Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Vick one feather bed and furniture called her bed as for the remainder of my estate my will and desire is after my debts is paid that it be devidid betwixt all my children, namely Achsah Vick, Jacob Vick, Elender Vick and Mary Vick as follows viz:

the two youngest shall have each one fourth more than the two eldest and I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend James Williams constable and my son Jacob Vick whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of March, in the year of our lord 1801

Item: I give unto my daughter Ann Pope three cows and calves to be delivered to her at her marriage or at the time that she arrives to the age of twenty one years to her and her heirs assign forever. Item: I give unto my daughter Susanna Newton, one cow and calf to her and her heirs and assigns, forever. Item: I lend unto my loving wife, Sarah Pope the land and plantation whereon I now live and all my crop and all my stock of all kinds that is not already given in the above legacies and all my household and kitchen furniture during her time or widowhood, Item: At the

death or marriage of my wife Sarah
