Item: I give to my daughter Ann Drake one hand saw, Item: I give to my daughter Elizabeth one fire shovel Item: My will and desire is that all the rest of my property that I have not given away in this will is to be sold and equally divided between my three living children viz. Elizabeth, Mason and Ann and I hereunto constitute and appoint my friend Fred Battle my executor to this my last will and testament this day and year above written.
