I do hereby authorize, empower, direct and require, the executor or Executors of William Wheelers deceased, or the heirs at law of the said William to convey, sell, transfer and set over all the lands, negroes, horses, mules &c. which I did convey to William Wheelers in trust in a deed or marriage settlement, made and entered into on the 20th day of January 1820 between myself, Elizabeth Wilhite and William Wheelers, Trustees. You will convey to my wife, Elizabeth and all my children and grandchildren all such lands and other property as is given or loaned to each of them in and by this my last Will above written. These conveyances you will make to them and their heirs forever after this will is proved and settled. Witness my hand and seal the 27th. day of March, 1833.

This piece forms a part of my will made the 27th. of March, 1832. In addition to the gift made to my wife Elizabeth Sills in the Will above, my Will is further to give to my wife Elizabeth Sills Two Hundred Dollars in addition to the Four Hundred Dollars given her in the Will above alluded to. Also I give to my said wife Elizabeth Sills my gray riding horse, saddle and best bridle. In addition to the land which I give to my son Gray Sills in the Will made the 27th. day of March, 1832, I now give and bequeath to him, my son Gray Sills, the following piece of land, say, beginning on the road leading from Raleigh to Halifax where I began the gift to him the said Gray Sills in the Doctor Malone Tract near the fence up on the long Hill, thence running a crotch the road south along Malones line to a corner post oak in Thomas's old line, thence East by said Thomas's line to Abraham Hedgepeths line cornering on a white oak, thence by said Hedgepeths line up to the old road a small corner Hickory, thence down the old road. My will is further, that all my farms be carried on for the year 1833 as they have been carried on for the present year, and all persons to continue on the same places, and pursue the same occupations as they are now pursuing, untill the end of the year 1833, or thereabouts, and other things belonging to the same regulated accordingly. The children to be schooled the year 1833 and my grandchildren, Batties, to be boarded in my family and sent to school with my children the year 1833. Witness my hand and seal as a part of my last. 28th. December, 1832.

I Mary Vick of the County of Nash and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God for the same, do this 30th day of September in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twentyone make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say. I give and bequeath to my son Asail Vick all my lands and plantations I am possessed of containing three hundred and seventy seven acres more or less adjoining the lands of Eli Vick, John Vick, Joseph Strickland and others to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Asail Vick ten negroes viz: George, Penny, Luke, Phil, Isaac, Esther, Charlotte, Willie, Chery and Chaney and their increase to him and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to my son Asail Vick all my stock and crop of every kind also all my household and kitchen furniture and plantation tools of every kind to him and his heirs forever. Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Charity Beckwith five pounds currency to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I hereby make and ordain my son Asail Vick executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Mary Vick have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
