Tempson shall become of lawful age, I also give to my wife fifty dollars in cash, to be paid by my executors where my estate is settled.

Item; 5th, I give and device to my daughter Flizabeth Williford one negro woman Lucy, upon her paying to my executors fifty dollars. Item 6th, I give and bequeath to my daughter Della Williford one

girl Jane, and one hundred and twenty five dollars to be paid by my executors at the settlement of my estate.

Item: 7th I give and bequeath to John Proctor one negro woman, Harriott, upon his paying to to my executors twenty five dollars.

Item 8th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Willifordone memory woman Patience and Child.

Item 9th. I give and bequeath to Samuel Moore one negro girl Caroline and one hundred and twenty five dollars to be paid by my executors at the settlement of my estate Item: 10th.

I give and bequeath to Orren R Daniel one negro girl, Mauraing, and one hundred and twenty five dollars to be paid by my executors at the settlement of my estate.

Itsm lith. I give and bequeath the device to my three sons Granberry V. Elijah L, and Dr. S. Tompson all the balance of the tract of and whereon I now live to be equally divided between them agreeably to valuation, so as for my son branberry to have thelot that was excepted in my wifes dower, on the west side of the big path to them and their heirs forever.

Item 12th. I give and Dequeath tomy four youngest children Blijah I., S. Tompson, Dellaand Marky B, each two hundred dollars to be expended for their education and other things which their guardian may see they mostly need.

Item: 13th, I give and bequeath to my son Granberry one hundred dollars to be expended as above by his guard ian, also all the claims in my possession that are payable to my deceased daughter.

Mertha Williard, and also one feather bed and furniture and one hair trunk and one pine chest.

Item: 14th. I give and bequeath to my four grand children Garoline, Andrew J. Mary Ann and Timothy enchiffy dollars Achth, to them and their heirs forever.

Item 15th, I give and bequeath to my two sons whijah I, and Dr. S. Tompson the two feather beds andfurniture that I have loaned to my wife, when thesaid Tompson shall arrive at the age of twentyone, years, and it is my will that the said negro woman Jinney and her increase shall be sold by my executors, at the time my youngest child shall arrive at the age of twentyone years, and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided between all my living children at that time.

Item 16th, I give and devise to my son be B. The two hundred acres of land whereon I now live, at the expiration of my wifes title to him andhic heirs forever.

Item 19th, By will and desire is that all the balance of my lands and

date, and all the balance of my perishable estate be sold on a credit of six months with interest from date, and all thebalance of my negroes not otherwise disposed of to be sold on a credit of twelve months withinterest from date. And all the proceeds arising from the sales of my said estate not otherwise disposed of to be equally divided between all myliving children.

Item 18th I hereby confirm all the gifts of property heretoforemade to my children. and lastly I dohereby constitute and appoint my son Blake williford and my friend William H. Hines, my lawfull executors to all intents and surposes to execute this my last will and test ment according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause there of, hereby reveking and declaring utterly null and void allother wills and testaments by me heretofore made. Inwitness whereof I the said williford do hereunto set my and and seal this 23 day of August in the year of our lord eight hundred.
