State of North Carolina being of sound
and memory and knowing the uncertainty of my
earthly existence do publish this as my last will
and testament in manner and form as follows to
wit I loan to my wife Elean during her natural
life the whole of my estate of every description
both real and personal and at her death I will and
direct that my whole Estate shall be divided into
two equal parts or shares one share of which
being one third of my whole estate I loan to
my daughter Turpy wife of James A Gayden
during her life and at her death I give and bequeath
the same to her children and their heirs to be
equally divided between them and share
alike One share being one third part of
my estate I loan to my grandson Mathew
Ellen during his life and at his death I
give and bequeath the same to his children &
their heirs to be equally divided between them
share and share alike The remaining share
being one third part of my whole estate I loan
to my grand daughter Elizabeth Ellen during
her life and at her death I give and bequeath
the same to her children and their heirs to be
equally divided between them share and
share alike In the event of the death of my
wife or either of my grand children Mathew
or Elizabeth without leaving issue him or
her surviving in that case it is my will
and desire that the share to which such
deceased child would have been entitled
to if living shall be equally divided be-
tween the survivors & the children of
my daughter Turpy and in the event
of the death of both grand children
Mathew and Elizabeth without leaving
issue from them and in that case
I give and bequeath the whole of my estate
both real and personal to the children of my

daughter Lempy and their heirs to be equally divided between them share & shares alike and in the event of the death of my daughter Lempy without leaving issue her surviving in that case I give and bequeath the part thus named to her being one third of my estate to my grandson children Matthew and Elizabeth and their heirs and in the event of the death of either Matthew or Elizabeth I will and direct that the whole of my go to the survivor his or her heirs as the case may be I do hereby constitute and appoint Richard M. Whitaker to this my last will and testament in testimony of all which I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this 7th day of March A.D. 1859 signed sealed published declared by the said Matthew Edwards to be his last will and testament who at his request and in his presence & in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses here to

Whitaker Whereas I Matthew Edwards have made my last will and testament in writing bearing date the 7th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine in which I have given to and bequeath to my daughter Lempy children a portion of my real and personal estate now there goes I do by this my writing in which I declare to be a codicil to my said last will and testament and to be a part thereof of order and declare that my will is that my daughter Lempy's children shall have a certain portion or lot of land on which my said daughter now resides on and that said lot of land shall be allotted to them as a part of their portion of my estate signified to them day beginning at the mouth of the Rocky branch branch at a

Whitaker line thence north along Whitakers line to the crest thence up the various courses of said crest to the beginning supposed to be one hundred and fifty to the same more or less and lastly it is my desire that this codicil be annexed to and made a part of my last will and testament as aforesaid to all intents and purposes in witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name affixed my seal this the 26th day of Oct in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven signed sealed in the presence of
