Item: I give and bequeath into my half brother Josiah Crudup one sorrell horse celt, raised at my plantation on Tar River near Capt. Samuel Bryant's and all my wearing eleths.

Item: I give unte my niece Mourning Arringten two negrees ,viz. Page and his wife Flora and their increase if any, four cews and calves ten head of sheep, one loom, four slays one feather bedand furniture, and a suit of mourning to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my niece Rheda Ricks one small negre girl named Vilet and her increase my bay horse I purchased at Newbern and a suit of mourning to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give unto my naeces Temperance Perry and Mary Perry each a suit of mourning.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my father-in-law Philimen Hawkins the fellowing negres, viz: Bett and two children Phillis & Aley and one other negre girl named Kitty which he has now in his pessession and their increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unte my Natural Daughter Mary Crawford a child of a late Elizabeth Crawford in Surry County in the State of Virginia all W land on the north side of Reancak River in Northamption county which lands

I purchased of Samuel Cotten and the estate of Frederick Ruffin centaining by estimation fifteen hundred acres with the fellowing negrees viz: Cull Fanlittle, Jacob Mitchell, one eyed Dick, Cale, Lucy. It is my will and desire that my blacksmith Lewis shall beallowed the use of his own shop and all the smiths tools thereunts

belonging that he shall have the privilege of getting and bringing coal wood on any part of my lands that are most convenient he shall also be intitled to the use and service of his wife the benefit of raising stock living on my plantation and cultivating lands at the discretion of my executors shall also have the use and service of his two sons, Phil and York on his paying into the hands of my exrso the sum of rifty pounds annually untill a division of the slaves hereafter named takes place then if he shall have taught his two sons Phil and York the black smiths trade he shall be entitled to all the tools belonging to his own shop his own freedom and his wifes forever.
