765 I Morning Hendrick of the County of Nash and State aforesaid being of sound Mind and disposing Memory but knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life do make and my last will and testament in manner and form as follows:

1st I desire that my executor here in after named shall see that my body have a decent burial.

2nd I desire that all my just debts be paid out of my estate

3rd I will and desire that my son John Rockley have one bed.

4th I will and desire that my daughter Sallie Vester have one bed.

5th I will and desire that my three daughters Sallie Vester Mary Ann Bryant and Julia Ann Warren have each one feather counterpane + blanket as good as new.

6th I will and desire that my executor pay to Mourning Marion my son now in Texas two dollars in cash should he fail to demand it in two years then I desire that my son S.S. Hendrick to have the same

7th I will to my beloved son S.S. Hendrick forty seven $\frac{3}{4}$ acres of land known as one half of the Julia Warren tract of land adjoining the lands of S.S. Hendrick & others to him and his heirs forever

8th I will and desire that my son S.S. Hendrick have all the remainder of my property of every description Impressing implicit confidence in my beloved son S.S. Hendrick I appoint him my executor to this my last will and testament date and day above written.

Bass the subscribers witnesses thereto who being duly sworn doth depose and say and cast for him self depositor and witness that he is a subscriber being witness to the paper writing now shown to him purporting to be the last will and testament of Mourning Hendrick that the said Mourning Hendrick in the presence of this depositor subscribe his name at the end of said paper writing which was shown to aforesaid and which bears date of the 27th day of Sept 1877 And the depositor further saith that the said Mourning Hendrick the testator of said did at the time of subscribing his name as aforesaid declare the said paper writing to be subscribed by him and exhibited to be his last will and testament and this depositor did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will as an attesting witness thereto and at the signature and in the presence of the said testator And this depositor further saith that at the said time when the said testator subscribed his name to the said last will as aforesaid and at the time of depositor's subscribing his name as an attesting witness thereto as aforesaid the said Mourning Hendrick was of sound mind and memory of full age to execute a will and was not under any restraint to the knowledge information or belief of this depositor And further this depositor say not
