Strickland two feather beds and furniture one looking glass also one walnut Table two pair of adirons and also all the horses or mules that is on hand after giving the two to the daughters as aforesaid in this will to him and his heirs forever item 5th I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Elizabeth H. Strickland one bed and furniture and one blue pine chest to her & her heirs for ever item 6th I give and bequeath to my grandson Edward D. Strickland one silver watch and one cow & calf to him and his heirs for ever it is further my will that all the balance of my house hold and kitchen furniture & gear with one Rockway one Brigg and the balance of the stock of cattle sheep and hogs to equally divided between my four children (viz) Noah, Nancy & Susan R. Strickland to them and their heirs for ever I also give and bequeath to my son Noah R. Strickland all of my working tools of all sorts and also all of my carts waggon &c and I do hereby appoint my Noah R. Strickland over to the will the 20 day of March 1888
