First I give and bequeath to my beloved son William W Boddie all my part of the crop and provisions on hand including the brandy cider vinegar, soap, salt fruit, preserves and to him and his heirs forever.

Second I give to my daughter Temperance Arrington twenty five dollars in money.

Third, I give to my three grand children to John L. Boddie, William W. Boddie and James B. H Boddie all my stock of hogs to be equally divided between.

Fourth. The balance of my property I wish to be equally divided between my daughters and my son W.W. Boddie equally.

and furthermore I nominate and appoint my son William W. Boddie executor to this my last will and testament revoking all others in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written. Signed, sealed and published in the presence of

In the Name of God Amen. I Sion Whitley of the County of Nash and State of North Carolina, being old and infirm but of sound and disposing memory do this the 13th June 1839 make publish and declare this instrument of writing to be and contain my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me made and declaring this to be the only one, in manner and form following viz: First I leave to my wife Prudence Whitley during her natural life or widowhood all the land that I have containing two hundred and twenty seven acres be the same more or less

adjoining the lands of John Jones, David Jones, Daniel A Duggins and others also I leave the same way to my wife Prudence Whitley one bed and furniture also my negro man Lemah two horses Jack and Peggy with all my corn, fodder, bacon, the balance of all my stock of cattle, hogs, sheep household and kitchen furniture and working tools and at the death or marriage of my wife Prudence Whitley, I dispose of the property loaned to my wife in the following manner. I give the lands with ~~all~~ its improvements to my son Josiah Whitley him his heirs forever. I give the horse Jack to my daughter Susan Whitley her heirs forever. I give the mare Peggy to my daughter Charlotte Whitley and her increase to her and her heirs forever the negro man Lenon is to be sold if he will sell and the proceeds to be equally divided between my two daughters Susan and Charlotte Whitley. If the negro man Lenon will not sell I make it obligatory on my son Josiah Whitley to take charge of said negro man Lenon and support him during his life all the other property that I have loaned to my wife Prudence Whitley during her natural life or widowhood when either event shall happen is to be sold and the proceeds equally divided between Sion Whitley and my two daughters Charlotte and Susan Whitley. Item: I give and bequeath to my son Wiest Whitley twenty five dollars to him and his heirs forever to be paid in money. Item: I give and bequeath to my son David Whitley one dollar to be paid him in cash.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Littleberry Whitley one dollar to be paid him in cash.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Lawrence Whitley one dollar to be paid to him in cash.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughters Charity Beckwith one dollar to be paid her in cash.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Josiah Whitley one mare named Jim one cow and calf all in his possession also one bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Lion Whitley one bed and furniture now in his possession.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Whitley, one bed and furniture one desk one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Charlotte Whitley, one bed and furniture and one large walnut table to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my grandson Isaac Whitley one cow and calf and one bull yearling to him his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Mary Jane Whitley daughter of Susan Whitley, twenty five dollars and it is my will and desire that my son Josiah Whitley should take charge of it.

Item: I give and bequeath all the balance of my notes and money to be equally divided between Sion, Charlotte and Susan Whitley to them and
