I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Harriett Adaline Drake one negro boy named Fil and one negro girl named Mima withher increase from this day andthree hundreddollars inmoney to her andherheirs forever. I give and bequeath to my grand son Rechard Armstrong Drake one negro man named Moses and five hundred dollars in money to him and hisheirs foregver.
