Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Sion Whitley my tract of land to him and his heirs forever and also my largest powder basin.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mourning Batchelor and my son Sion Whitley my negro woman Dinah equally to ensh to be divided according to their desires. My desire is that the remainder of my property be sold and that my just debts be paid out of the proceeds and that Mourning Batchelor have fifty dollars of the same and then the balance of the money if any to be equally divided betwixt my son Willie Whitley, Joel Whitley, Mourning Batchelor and Sion W. Whitley. I hereby appoint Timothy Ferrell my executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal the 12th day of March, A D 1831

In The name of God Amen. I Rhoda Daniel of the County of Nash and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

First I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Kitty Lewis Beckwith and my grand son William Dawson Beckwith, and the lawful heirs of my daughter Temperance Beckwith, if any there may hereafter be, one negro woman by the name of Olive and her increase, subject nevertheless to the use and benefit of my daughter Temperance during her natural life.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Daniel one negro girl by the name of Linda and her increase to him and his heirs forever, also one negro woman by the name of Dorcas, and her increase. Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my grand son John Richardly Dudley one negro girl by the name of Betty, subject nevertheless to the use and benefit of my daughter Jacky Dudley, during her life, and should the said Jacky Dudley ~~during her life~~ and should the said Jacky hereafter have other lawful heirs then and in that case for them all to share equally.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Kitty Lewis Beckwith, one negro girl by the name of Waty to her and her heirs forever.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my grand son William Dawson Beckwith one negro boy by the name of Harry, to him and his heirs forever.

Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Jacky David Dudley one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf and one sow and pigs.

Seventhly, I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Daniel, one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf, one sow and pigs to him and his heirs forever.

Eightly: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Kitty Lewis Beckwith one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever.

Ninthly, I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Daniel, one mule.

Tenthly, I give and bequeath to my grand children Kitty Lewis Beckwith and Wm Dawson Beckwith one gray horse, subject nevertheless to the use and benefit of my daughter Temperance Beckwith during her natural life.

The remainder of everything I may be seized or possessed of at my death to be equally divided among my children, Joshua, Temperance and Jacky and I hereby constitute and appoint my son Joshua my whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament, disannulling all others by me made or intended to be made. I John Vick of Nash County and State of North Carolina being old and infirm but of sound mind and disposing memory blessed be God for the same do this the fifth day of April in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one do make publish and declare the following paper writing to be and contain my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me made heretofore and declaring this to be the only one in manner and form following viz: 1st. my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid and they are but few by my executors hereafter named. 2nd. Item: I leave to my loving wife Mary Vick during her natural life one tract or parcel of land with all its improvements containing four or five acres be the same more or less bounded as follows beginning at a corner sassafras thence running up the old line to a corner pine thence up the old orchard mound to the old cider press thence round a line of marked trees to the first station, with the privileges of fire wood and ~~all~~ timber on the ballance of my lands that I did possessed of and at the death of my said wife Mary Vick I give the above named lands with all its improvements to my grand son William Vick to him and his heirs forever. I also leave to my wife Mary Vick during her natural life and no longer the following named property viz: one young horse named Buck one bridle and saddle two cows and three calves two earling two years old five hundred pounds of bacon fifteen gallons lard, fifteen barrels of corn, ten bushels wheat one cow and pigs her choice four sheats one buffett one safe, one oval table one bed and furniture her choice one large trunk one barrel of brandy one hog's head rider six sitting chairs three wicker and three common, one gigue and harness two sides of leather all the cotton and flax on hand one loom and gear one flax wheel six pewter plates, two pewter dishes two pewter basins all her choice two butter potts, two jugs her choice six earthen plates two earthen dishes one lett of cups and saucers all her choice six pewter table spoons six tea spoons one copper coffee miller one dutch oven one spider all her choice two potts and hooks two potts rakes all her choice all my fowls, six cider hog's head six barrels all her choice also one hundred dollars to be paid her by my executors and at the death of my said wife Mary Vick all the above named property

loaned to my said wife Mary Vick during her natural life the land excepted to be equal divided between my three children then and each of their heirs viz: Priscilla Whitfield, Patience Vick and Elijah Vick. Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Priscilla Whitfield one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever Item: I give and bequeath to my two granddaughters the children of my son Eli Vick viz: Adenda and Mary M.V. Vick twenty five dollars each also thirty acres of land jointly joining the lands of Asahel Vick lying in the piney woods to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my four grand children the children of my son Josiah Vick viz: Louisa, John, Benj. and Josiah Vick one hundred and fifty dollars to be equally divided between them all to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Elijah Vick a certain tract of land with all its improvements lying and being in the county of Nash and bounded as follows beginning at the mouth of Allens Spring Branch thence along a line of marked trees to a pine thence by a line of marked trees to a persimmon tree thence down the dividing line between myself and the heirs of Loderick ~~3~~ Allen to the creek thence along the creek to the first station also one hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my grand son William Vick son of my son John Vick all the ballance of my lands that I have not heretofore disposed of to him and his heirs forever. also the ballance of my cider casks one still and its contents one shot gun one desk one bed and furniture one cow and calf one sow and pigs to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to Vilett Griffin one cow and calf one earling one bed and furniture and dressing glass and twenty five dollars in cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Cryslina Vick daughter of my son John Vick two hundred dollars cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Charity Batchelor daughter of my son Joel Vick one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my four grand children the children of my daughter Priscilla Whitfield viz: Isaac Whitfield, John Whitfield, Penelope Whitfield and Eli Whitfield Fifty Dollars each to them and their heirs forever.

Item: My will and desire is that my son Elijah Vick be the agent for my daughter Patience Vick and all her children that she has now or hereafter may have and that a sum of three hundred dollars is to be left in the hands of my said son Elijah Vick which sum is not to be applied any other way only for the support and maintenance of my said daughter Patience Vick and all her children that she now has or hereafter may have to be dished out to them as economy and good judgment requires.
