Item: My will and desire is that the land which is lent to my wife, at her death or marriage be equally divided between my two sons Isaac and John Watkins to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

Item: My further will is that my ~~Said~~ Horse and Diamond Filly as also the rest of the property not heretofore given nor lent to be sold and money arising from said sale to be divided between all my children and lastly I do hereby appoint my friend Jacob Horn and my son Isaac Watkins as executors to this my last will and testament making void all former wills by me made.

I Sarah Williams of Nash County being of sound perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this fourteenth day of June In the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight doth make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth. that is to say- I first give my beloved soul to God that first gave it me and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a christian manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and as to my worldly goods that God hath blessed me with I dispoeth in the following manner to wit after all my just debts paid and my funeral expenses paid; the negro man by the name of Godfrey is to return to his master Drury Williams or his heirs with out any expenses or money paid. to wit the five negroes belonging to me by the names of Phillis, Buck, Bob, Addam and Primus is to be sold and all the rest of my property of all sort or kind and to be equally divided between my five living children and

three of my grand children to wit Rowland Williams, James Williams, Joel Williams, Morning Tisdale and Drury Williams to wit My grand Children Drury Williams the son of Billy Williams deceased, being the legacy that I allotted for him the said Billy Williams deceased and ~~if~~ said Drury Williams died before he had and lawful heirs to his brother Samuel Williams and the money arising from the said property to continue in the hand of my son Drury Williams until the said Drury Williams arrives to the age of twenty one to wit My Grandson Keddick Driver the son of Nanny Driver, deceased being the Legacy that I allotted for her the said Nanny Driver and the money arising from the said property to remain in the hands of my son Drury Williams until the said Keddick Driver demand, <sup>on</sup> his lawful attorney to wit my grandson Nathan Williams the son of Nathan Williams deceased being the legacy that I allotted for him the said Nathan Williams deceased the money arising from said property to be equally divided between them eight and Nathan Person them and their heirs forever to wit Rowland Williams, Jonas Williams, <sup>Joel Williams, Drury Williams, Morning Tisdale, Keddick Driver the son of Nanny Driver, Dest.
