

In the Name of God Amen. I Sophia Curl of the county of Nash and State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but in perfect mind and memory return thanks to god for the same do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit:

First my will and desire is that all my Just debts be paid.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Vick my old bay mare linnen my bay horse mager one bed and furniture, first choice also my old negro woman Rachel one woollen wheel and cards also 6 sitting chairs also 6 new powder plates, one dish one basin to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Westray one loom and gear one linnen wheel also I lend one bed and furniture to my daughter Mary Westray until her oldest daughter arrives to age or marries and then to be equally divided between Salley T. Westray and Kiseah Westray to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son ^{Samuel} L. Curl one bed and furniture to be kept and taken care of by Sam Vick untill said Sam arrives to the age of twenty one years or marries also I give him one blue chest to be taken care of in like manner to him and his heirs forever. I also charge said ^{Samuel} L. Curl the hire of his negro Sam and the interest of his money for raising clothing and schooling said orphan. My will and desire is after all my just debts and legacies be paid and that the ballance of my estate if any be equally divided amongst my children Mary Westray Sam Vick, and ^{Samuel} L. Curl to them and their heirs forever.

also all the cattle and sheep that came from my brother Sams and their increase I leave to him Sam Westray to do what he please with. Also my will and desire is that all I have should be taken care of and kept together by my son Sam Vick as tho I was to live until his finishes his crop all to his use and profit. Also I constitute and appoint my loving son Sam Vick my hole and sole executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 18th day of March, 1814.

In the Name of God Amen I Joel Walker of Nash County being in a low State of health but of sound memory doth constitute ordain and declare this my last will and testament.

Imprimis: I give and bequeath unto my son Micajah Walker one hundred acres of land the plantation where he now lives on on the south side of the road also the property that I have lent to keep ~~him~~ on to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Jonnothan Walker one dollar to him and his heirs forever..

Item: I leave my son Lemuel Walker twenty five acres of land the plantation where he now lives on to live on his life or so long as he sees cause but not to sell nor trade in any case what ever also what other property I have lent him before this I give to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Walker seventy five acres of land on the north side of tumblin creak the plantation where he now lives on taken of the lower end of my track adjoining the road and Edwards and Williams lines also the property that I have heretofore lent him to live on to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Jesse Walker one hundred acres of land the manner plantation where I now live on the ballance of my tract of land also the twenty five acres of land that I leave to my son Lemuel Walker whenever he quits it. also all my cider casks and all my iron tools and my two head of horses and all my stock of hogs and two thirds of my stock of cattle having his choice of them and all my household furniture except one feather bed and one cotton wheel and cards at my decease to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to my wife Silvia one feather bed and cotton wheel and cards her life and then to my daughter Patsy to her and her heirs forever also I give my wife Liberty to live on my plantation above given to my son Jesse Walker her life if she chose it.

Item: I also leave one third of my stock of cattle and my stock of sheep to be equally divided between my three daughters ^(Jemmes) Jane, Hedgpeeth, Polly Kittle and Patsy Walker to them and their heirs forever. at my decease. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of July, 1813.
