Item 12th. I give and bequeath to my son Wortham "hite one negro boy named Isham and one feather bed which he has in possession to him and his heirs forever; also at my death I give to my son Wortham White one negro woman named Amy to him and his heirs forever.

Item 13th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Wheeler one negro girl named Winneford and her increase one feather bed and furniture three cows and calves now in her possession to her and her heirs forever.

Item 14th. I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Hartfield White that part of land I purchased of William Silbro which I now possess also a tract of land I purchased of Titus Lewis also the tract of land which I lent to my wife Elizabeth at her death. I also give my son Joseph one feather bed and furniture and one shot gun to him and his heirs forever.

Item: 15th. My will and desire is that my Hubbert tract of land containing about two hundred and twenty four acres and my negro man Peter and two thirds of my stock of every kind and two thirds of my house hold and kitchen furniture also two thirds of all the ~~crop~~ and provisions that may be remaining on the plantation at my death also my mill and blacksmith tools with two thirds of my farming tools to be sold at my death except my negro man Peter which I have lent to my said wife Elizabeth during her natural life and after death to be sold and the money to be divided between all my above named children equally. Also my wish and desire is for all the moneys arising from the sale or sales of the above named property with all notes bonds, accounts and cash that may be on hand at the time of my death after paying all my just debts to be equally divided between all of my above named children.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my son Joseph Hartfield White and my friends Leroy Mitchell and Callum Moore executors to this my last will and testament, truly revoking all other wills by me made heretofore.
