

I, Susannah Walker of Nash County North Carolina being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make and declare my will as follows to wit:-

Item 1st I give and bequeath all my interest in my negroes making Tools and furniture belonging to Lewis D. Walker my son, to him I consider them articles, now belonging to him his heirs and assigns.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Lewis D. Walker and my daughter Emeline Walker my share and my share and my share to be equally divided between them their heirs and assigns.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to Harburt Walker, Lewis D. Walker my son and to Emeline Walker my daughter their beds, bedsteads and furniture to each to them their heirs and assigns.

Item 4th I give devise, will and bequeath all the balance of my estate of every description whether consisting of land, personal property or chattels in action to all of my living children to wit: Lawrence Walker, William Henry Walker Lewis D. Walker Harburt Walker, Polly Siggitt and Caroline Walker to be equally divided between them their heirs and assigns I hereby constitute and appoint Lewis D. Walker to execute this my last will and testament.
