My desire is that my wife Frances Haney keep the residue and remainder of my estate to raise my children on, if she my said wife, doth not by neglect or extravagancy waste my said estate and if so, my desire is that my executors make sale of the same living, and equally divide the same between my wife and my three daughters to wit Mary, Elizabeth, Frances, to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I doth hereby appoint my kind friends Mason Flowers, Jesse Battle, executors to this my last will and testament and I doth hereby revoke all wills hereto by me made and doth constitute and appoint and ordain and declare this to be my last will and testament, this 15th day of June in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand seven hundred and eighty two.
