In The Name of God Amen, This twelfth day of October and in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and ninety one. I, Thomas Viverett of the State of North Carolina and County of Nash being very sick of body but of perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die de make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say'd principally and first of all I commit my soul into the hands of God who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent and christian manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned and calling to mind the things of the world wherein it hand pleased God to bless me with in this life I give bequeath and dispose of the same in manner and form following viz:

Imprimis: I give and bequeath to my loving son Henry Viverett all my land lying on the south side of the little swamp and all the cleared land at the nat place and a bar from any more then what's cleared and seen tended and one negre man named Jef one negre man named Jack, one negre woman named Dimer two cows and earlings and one stud horse that I bought of Jaceb Boyet and one mare called the Bell filley and one sadle and bridle and one feather bed and furniture as his own and to be disposed of at his pleasure.

Item: I give and bequeath to my loving son Launcelot Viverette all my land lying on both sides of a prong of town creek with the manner plantations thereunto belonging and one negro man named cuffe one negro woman named old bet one negro woman named Ame, one negro woman named Sue and all my stock of cattle and hogs at my Turner place one mare and celt called fan one saddle and bridle and one feather bed and furniture as his own and to be disposed of at his pleasure.

Item: I give and bequeath to my loving son Micajah Viverette my plantation and all my land joining thereunto on the north side of Tar river and all the stock of cattle andhogs that is already there and three cows and calves from my home plantation and three sows and pigs from my home place, one mare filley called old soops filley one large bay horse called Liberty one saddle and bridle two feather beds and furniture and one chest that stands in my little room and one negro man named Harry, one negro woman named Little Bet one negro boy named Nat as his own and to be disposed of at his pleaseure.

AND THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPER

Item: I give and bequeath to my loving son James Viverette my manner plantation whereon I now live and all the remainder of my land and plantations which I have not already given away and one negro woman named Pat and herfirst child named Fillip and one negro boy named Mose and all my goods and chattels that is in my store house and all the remainder's of my stock of cattle hogs, and herses house hold goods and chattels with all my working tools and carpenters tools and one whip saw and cross cut saw as his own and to be disposed of at his pleasure.

I lend to my loving wife edlizabeth Viverette my manner Item: the cong place & Artis place plantation where I now live and/all the stock of catt cattle, hogs and horses sheep and my household goods and chattels and working tools Carpenters tools, whip saw and cross cut saw and threelnegroes as I gave to my son James Viverette during of her natural life and widowhood and after her decease or widowhood to my son James Viverette as before mentioned as his own and to be disposed of at his pleasure excepting one mulate child named Jude I give to Patsey Dear as her own and to be disposed of at her pleasure. All which I desire may be done at the discretion of Lamon Ruffin and Nathan Tart and Jesse Pitman whom I nominate and ordain whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament . In witness whereof I the said Thomas Viverette have hecunto set my hand and fixed my seal this day and year above written. 1791.
