Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Levecy Lawrence one negro woman by the name of Annacy to her and her heirs forever. Also one nefe, one dutch even Also all my wearing cloths.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my grandson John Devenport one bed and furniture.

Item: My Will and desire is that all my property real and personal that is not given away by this my last Will should be sold and be equally divided between my two daughters Deniska Rogers and Levecia Lawrence and John Devenport to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I constitute and appoint my friend William Boddie executor of this my last will and testament and I do hereby publish and pronounce this to be my last will and testament.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son William one silver dollar to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin one silver dollar to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Elish Whitfield one silver dollar to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Israel Whitfield one hundred and fifteen acres of land it being part of the tract of land that I now live on and bounded as followeth beginning at a branch on the north side of peach tree creek upon the bank of said creek and then along a line of marked trees to a hickory a corner tree in my old line thence East along the old line to pig basket creek thence down said creek to a Water oak thence along my line to Richard Thomas line and along said Thomas line to Peachtree creek and up said creek to the first station and one bed and furniture two cows and calves, two ewes and lambs to him his heirs and assigns, forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Hardy one Hundred and fifty acres, of land it being the other part of the tract of Land that I live on two cows and calves two ewes and lambs and bed and furniture one apple mill to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary one silver dollar to her & her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah one silver dollar to her & her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mildred one silver dollar to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one bed and furniture to her and heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary one bed and furniture two cows & calves three ewes & lambs & all my household and kitchen furniture that I have not heretofore given away to her her heirs and assigns forever. My will and desire is that my Executor hereafter named do sell all the remainder part of my estate or so much thereof as will pay my debts either at publick or private sale as they shall think best and ~~either~~ if there should be any part of my estate remaining after my debts is paid that I have not heretofore given away I desire the same to be equally divided between my two sons (to wit) Israel and Hardy. Lastly I do constitute and appoint my loving son Solomon Whitfield and Hardy Whitfield my executors of this my

last will and testament Revoking all other wills and testaments do own and acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 6th day of July 1782.

Item: I give and bequeath my beloved wife Ann Rogers the possession of this land as long as she lives, six choice head of cattle, a negro woman by the name of Will during her life a black horse and a gray mare the grind stone and working tools the house and furniture, three beds and furniture all the sheep all the hogs I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Rogers all the land that he now lives on containing to a hundred and sixty acres more or less a negro boy by the name of Danell I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Rogers a negro girl by the name of Patty, a negro boy by the name of Phill six head of cattle. I give and bequeath to my son Robert Rogers, a Negro boy by the
