Imprimis: I lend unto my mother Penelope Nicholson two negroes of her choice during her natural life.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Nicholson all my lands wiz; all thelands which fell to me by my fathers will also one tract adjoining by the name of the Jandingham place also the land whereon Inow live, also the land I bought of Joseph Marcs also my right in the land adjoining it, which was lent to me by my fathers will, also the land in Edgecombe County on "ishing Creek which was part of thelands of Absolum Benton Deceased, to her and her heirs forever. Also I give unto my said daughter Sally Micholson all my negroes (including the two which are lent to my mother after her death) to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my Sister Sally M. Philips onehundred Dellars also the right of dower I now own in the lands which formally belongs to Robert Thompson deceased to her and her heirs forever.

Item: My will and desire also is that all the property which I have not given may of all kinds whatsoever be sold at publick sale and after my just debts are paid out of themoney rising from such sale a together with the money now due me that if there should be remaining in the hands of my executors the sum of five hundred dollars of said money that my sisters Martha "lizabeth and "ancy Nicholson should have one Hundred Dollars each, to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Saily Michelson, all the remainder of my estate of all kinds whatsoever which I have not already given away to her and her heirs forever, but if my daughter Salley Michelson should die before she comes to the age of twenty one years or Marries my will and desire is that all my estate which I have given her be equally divided between all my sisters and if she should marry and die without leaving any child my will then is that all the lands which I have given her be equally divided between all my sisters viz Laticia Growell, Sally M. Philips, Martha Michelson, Penelope Whitfield, Polley Ecke, Fereby Shelten, Mizabeth Michelson, and Mancy Nickelson, to them and theirheirs forever.

Item: My will and desire is that if at any time during the life of my mother she should be accident or other wise be reduced to low circumstances that we executors do maintain her generally out of the property arising from the estate

I have given away to my daughter before mentioned.

Item: My further will and desire is that my executors shall have the management of my daughter and that they have her well educated and genteeld.

Also one negro man Hard andone negro woman Dinah onehalf of the still all the cyder casks onehalf of my part of the Mill also one mannamed Pele, one horse named Jack one mare named Diagmond andher two colts. also half of my flock of cattle, sheep andhogs also half the brandy now on hand, all my plantation tools, one cart and wheels, also all the household andkitchen furntirue, also all the production of my farm for the presentyear, and at her death or marriage I give the aboveproperty except the land and negroes to be equally divided between all my children.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Daughter Charlotte Watkins two negroes Mourning and Toney also one grey Horse to her andherheirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Salley Ricks two negree Silvy and Simon also one cow and calf one now and pigs to her andherieirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Watking all my land lying on the south side of Kirbys creek in cluding the falls of Tar river together with onehalf of my part of the mill also half of my still, also one negro man named. Jim and one boy named Tom and one horse to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Riem: By mill and desire is that the Balance of my negroes which are not bratefore given ar lost be equally divided between my four youngast children
