Williams and all the rest of my estate that I lent to her the said Martha I leave to be sold and the money arising from the same I leave to be divided between all the heirs lawfully begotten heirs of my body.

Item: That I give to my son Pilgrim S. Williams all the land that I now own or am possessed with.

Item: That I leave all the rest and remainder of my estate to be sold and the money to be divided equally between my son Pilgrim S. Williams and my daughter Dinah and Charity, Elisabeth and Lawful begotten heirs of my Daughter Priscilla and all the negroes and other property that I had already given away to my son Pilgrim S. Williams and my daughter Dinah and my daughter Charity and my daughter Elisabeth my will and desire is that the negroes and other property will remain with them and be there own right and property.

Item: That the notes that I have against my son Pilgrim S. Williams my will for one hundred pounds virginia my will is that money arising from said note be equally divided between son Pilgrim S. Williams and my daughter Dinah and my daughter Charity and Elisabeth.

Item: That all the money that I paid in discharge of debts against the estate of Thomas Ricks deceased be redusted of the legacy that I have given to them in this will

Item: that I give to Thomas Ricks son of Urban Ricks one negro girl named Fereba and if she the said negro breed and bring children in term of twenty ^{five} years of age the first two children that she bears is my will and desire that they belong to Thomas Ricks son of Urban Ricks and if she bears no children said negro is then to be sold and the money equally divided between the said Thomas Ricks and Teala Ricks.

and my negro man Norfolk I leave in the care of my son Pilgrim S. Williams and said Pilgrim S. Williams is to remain for his trouble five pounds yearly as long as said negro lives.

Item. That the money that is in the hands of James Duprey and Ascy Duprey be equally divided between Pilgrim S. Williams and Martha Williams his mother and I do hereby appoint my son Pilgrim S. Williams and Wilson Taylor jun. executors to this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke disallow and disannul every other former will or testament before this time named ratifying and confirming this

I Walker Massengill of Nash County and State of North Carolina being sick and weak but of sound mind and perfect memory do make ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth. I give and bequeath unto my son James Massengill all the land that I am possessed with that lies on the north side of the Spring branch.

I give bequeath unto my son Walker Massengill my land and plantation I now live on also one young mare called fly Bridle and saddle, also four sows and pigs also one feather bed and all my working tools one big pott and hooks one chest and trunk.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Annis Massengill one feather bed and furniture one chest.

I lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Massengill all the rest of my estate and it is my will and desire that after her decease that half the household furniture should be divided between my son Walker Massengill and my daughter Annis Massengill afore mentioned and the other half of my household furniture to be sold and divided among my six children James Massengill, Walker Massengill, Hancover Richardson, Milly Turner, Annis Massengill and Sarah Lawrence, and I further appoint my son James Massengill and my son Walker Massengill my sole and sole executors of this my last will and testament and revoke all former wills by me hereto fore made and do establish this to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of September 1814.
