Vick and Asahel Vick executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said John Vick have hereunto set my hand and seal the year and date first

Item: I give to my son Joel Davis Bunn one bay horse to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my wife Rachel Bunn all the remainder part of my estate both real and personal and of whatsoever kind to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I do ordain and appoint my wife Rachel Bunn and my two sons John Jolly Bunn and Joel Davis Bunn my whole and sole executors to this my last will and testament revoking all other wills heretofore by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty one.
