of all of my land (in valuation) to have and

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter
O. B. Brown wife of Lawson Brown all of my
Stock consisting of one black mare with
all ears and brags also all cart's Plans
Hors and all other farming utensils
of all description to her belonging.

Item, My will and desire is that all the
residue of my estate (if any) after taking
out the debts and legacies above mentioned
and shall be sold and the debts owing
to me collected and if there should
be any surplus over and above the
payments debts and expenses and leg-
acies that such surplus shall be equ-
ally divided and paid to all my chil-
dren in equal portion share and share
alike to them and each and every of
them their executors administrators
and assigns absolutely forever.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and
appoint my trusty friend Willis Ward
my lawful executor to all intents and
purposes to execute this my last will
and testament according to the true
intent and meaning of the same and every
part and clause thereof truly executing
and declaring utterly void all other
will and testaments by me heretofore
made.
