I Jackson R. Driver being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

First - that my executor herein after named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay all my funeral expenses.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I give and devise to my beloved wife Luenda Driver One hundred and Sixty Eight acres of land known as home tract whereon I now live so as to include my Marriage house all out houses and other improvements to have and to hold during the term of her widowhood then to her bodily heirs Also one horse male iron gray. Call off Bill one Dark bay horse and buggy. One goat oven and cast iron first choice cow Eight first choice hogs All the house hold and kitchen furniture and all the farming implements Kind. I give and devise to my Daughter Gilly Jane and Penning and my Son William B. Driver all the remainder of my lands to be equally divided between them and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Luenda Driver my lawfull executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause there of hereby making and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

I am 3<sup>rd</sup> Upon the death of my wife Geramy I will and bequeath my tract of land on which I now live to My son Lafayette Harper and my two daughters Germit Louisa and Francis Ann equally to share and share alike And I desire that they should all live together on the same I further desire that the tract of land should never be sold out of the family but to remain in the same And should Lafayette die leaving no lawful heirs then I desire that the two girls Germit Louisa & Francis Ann have the entire tract of land share and share alike <sup>as</sup> on the same and her or her heirs to have all and in case the same should die leaving no issue then and in that case I will and desire that my three sons Ralph Mc Robert Henry and Spencer Harper have the same to share and share alike to them and their heirs forever

I am 4<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire and request that my son Augustus Lafayette shall upon my death remain and carry on my farm for the assistance of his mother during her life and after her death to continue the same for his own benefit and the benefit of my two daughters Germit Louisa and Francis Ann Harper as long as they remain unmarried

I am 5<sup>th</sup> I hereby nominate and appoint my son Augustus Lafayette my executor to this my last will and testament In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand & seal this the 11<sup>th</sup> day June 1878
