In the name of God Ameed. I Abraham Newhick  
of the State of North Carolina a County of New Hanover, considering  
the uncertainty of this mortal life and certainty of death, do  
make and publish this my last Will and Testament, in manner  
and form following, viz,  
First. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Rachel Newhick  
the following negroes, viz., Lydia, Stellar, Kate, George, Simon,  
Charlotte, Hammie, Dove, Sam, Charles, Jerry, April, Ningo,  
Daniel. Also my manor plantation five hundred and one thirty  
acres, with all the appurtenances to the same belonging. Also  
my household and kitchen furniture, stock, of every kind, plantation  
and blacksmiths tools. And my said wife Rachel Newhick, is  
to support and school all my children which may not be scholars  
at my decease. All the above property my wife shall hold during  
her natural life and after her decease the said lands and also  
all other lands of which I am possessed at my decease and not  
hereafter willed in this will to be equally divided between my  
sons Joseph Newhick, Timothy Newhick, and Henry P. Newhick,  
and after my said wife's decease all the above negroes together  
with their increase and the balance of my wife's legacy to be  
equally divided between my sons Joseph, Timothy, Bryan, Benjamin  
H. Henry P. and Jacob, F. Newhick.  
Also left unto my daughter Penny Newhick, during her natural  
life the following negroes, Abig, Dolly and Dinah and Pinah, children

my, John, Bell, besides, Guilford, Rington and Sanduson bed and  
furniture, and at her decease to the lawful heir of her body, if any  
such there be, and if none, to return to the lawful heir of my body  
and to be equally divided amongst them.  
I also give and bequeath unto my daughter, Mary Newell Mallis the  
following negroes, Big, Lige and Trotter and their increase, also one  
bed and furniture.  
I also give and bequeath unto my son Bryan Newkirk, three negroes, Bob,  
Bet and Caesar, and their increase, one bed and furniture.  
I also give and bequeath unto my daughter, Ann Williams the fol-  
lowing negroes, Ned, Golph, Taff and Isaac, and their increase, also  
one bed and furniture.  
I also give and bequeath unto my son Henry A. T. Newkirk, the following  
negroes, Bigg, young Peter, Chloe and Rosetta their increase, also  
bed and furniture.  
I also give and bequeath unto my son Jacob A. Newkirk, my lower  
plantation known by the name of the New ground, containing three  
hundred and twenty acres, also the following negroes, Big, Lige and  
Sally and their increase, one bed and furniture. All the above  
legacies to remain in the possession of my said wife Rachel Newkirk  
until the heirs come of age or marry; and if there be any disor-  
derly disobedient negroes I desire that such be hired out to the  
advantage until the owners are capable of taking them into possession  
And I the said Abraham Newkirk do hereby appoint my beloved  
wife Rachel Newkirk, Executrix and my sons Joseph Newkirk & Timothy  
Newkirk Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking  
all former Wills by me made, do ordain and establish this my last  
Will and Testament, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and seal the nineteenth day of July in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three.
