I A. M. Lelland being in perfect mind and senses, do by this my last will and Testament give unto my children, viz, John Angus M. Lelland, a feather bed, two sheets and two blankets, and one small shot gun in the possession of Henry Maltrop for my son John, if the gun is in good order, and if not to be left on said Maltrop's hands by his paying for her.

I give and bequeath unto my brother, Arch. M. Lelland, one fine shirt, one round horseman's jacket and pantaloons and waistcoat, and boots, the pantaloons and horseman's jacket are green, and the waistcoat and bleached striped stuff.

Daniel M. Lelland I give and bequeath one northern homespun shirt one cassinet round jacket, one dark mixed homespun jacket, and one pair northern homespun pantaloons, and one pair socks.

I also give unto Peter M. Lelland my coarse apparel, one white northern homespun shirt, three pair pantaloons, two pair drawers, one homespun coat, one flannel shirt, two waistcoats and two pair socks.

To Hannah Ganey for her services to me during my sickness, all the provision which remains in the house after my decease, twelve pound coffee, six pound manufactured tobacco, one table, two pots and all the earthenware that belongs to the house, and one set knives and forks, my boat, hat, and a trunk where I keep my clothing, also the use of my mare, saddle and bridle for her to ride to South Carolina to my brother Archibald, and then my brother Archibald to take possession of the mare, saddle and bridle.

I also leave my brother Archibald as executor, to this my last will and Testament, I want him to sell my mare, saddle and bridle and all the rest of my goods and chattels, except the articles which I have given away.
