In the first place after all my just debts are paid out of my estate I give and bequeath to Mrs. Mary Baldwin, a certain negro girl aged about six years by name Sarah, -

I give and bequeath to Mrs. Mary Allen a certain negro girl aged about seven years by name Nancy, -

I give and bequeath also to my brother, Almon Hall, children, and to my sister, Elizabeth Spooler, all the remaining part of my negroes, to wit, Ben, Benty, Jacob, Rhoda, and her three children Ben, Sam and Martha, Claudia and her two children Dick and Rhoda, Minnie, and also the house and lot I now occupy, to be divided equally, share and share alike; it is understood in case of my sister, Elizabeth, death all her interest in above property will go to her heirs. -

I direct all my household and kitchen furniture to be sold and the proceeds of sale to be applied to payment of my debts should the amount of sale be sufficient, if not sufficient, to be paid out of my estate; if however the sale of my furniture be more than enough to discharge my debts, the balance will go to my brother, Almon Hall's children and sister, Elizabeth Spooler, and her heirs. -

I do now constitute and make Wm. S. Harris Executor, to this my last Will and Testament. - Given under my hand and seal this the 20th of January, 1835 -

The residue of all my real and personal property, of whatever description or kind I give after, as is mentioned above, that is, after all my just debts are paid, to my brother, Almon Hall's children and my sister, Elizabeth Spooler, share and share alike. 1835 Feb'y 4th
