the enjoyment of my usual health; but aware of the infirmities of  
human nature, do make, ordain, publish and declare this  
instrument of writing for and as my last Will and Testament, hereby  
revoking all others by me heretofore made -  
I consign my body to decent burial, and entreat for my soul the  
mercy of my creator, the judge of the universe, through the merits and  
mediation of the blessed Redeemer, of mankind -  
I give, devise and convey unto Richard Duince Moore, the son of Major  
A D Moore, and his heirs and assigns forever, my rice plantation  
situate, lying and being in the county of Brunswick, State aforesaid  
known by the name of the Hamilton plantation -  
I give, devise and convey unto Armand John Moore the son of Major  
A D Moore, and his heirs and assigns forever, all my lands in the  
County of Brunswick, aforesaid known by the name of "Grovelly" -  
I give, devise and convey unto my cousin Alexander Duince  
Moore, the son of Major A D Moore, and his heirs and assigns for-  
ever, a lot of ground or piece of land in the town of Fayetteville in  
the County of Cumberland and State aforesaid, to be selected by the  
said Major A D Moore out of my lots of ground or pieces of land  
of which I may be seized at the time of such selection; the situation  
size and extent of the said devised lot to be designated by the said  
Major A D Moore at any time before his death; and in case the  
said Major A D Moore shall omit to perform said trust or duty,  
then it is my will and desire that the said selection and design-  
ation should be made by his executors or administrators -  
I give, devise and convey unto James Moore the son of Major A  
D Moore, and his heirs and assigns forever, a lot of ground or  
piece of land in the town of Fayetteville aforesaid, to be selected by  
the said Major A D Moore out of any lots of ground or pieces of  
land of which I may be seized at the time of such selection, the  
situation, size and extent of the said devised lot to be design-  
ated by the said Major A D Moore at any time before his death  
and in case the said Major A D Moore shall omit to perform  
said trust or duty, then it is my will and desire that the  
said selection and designation should be made by his executors  
or administrators -  
I give and bequeath unto Julia Ann Moore the daughter of Major  
A D Moore, and her Executors and Administrators forever, a female  
slave named Mary -  
I give and bequeath unto Polly Moore the daughter of Major A D Moore  
and her Executors and Administrators forever, a female slave named Peggy -  
I give and bequeath unto Sarah Moore the daughter of Major A D Moore

and her, Executors and Admors forever, a girl a slave named Hateria  
I give and bequeath unto Milaresa Davis Moore the daughter of Major  
A D Moore and her, Executors and Admors forever, a female slave  
called Nanny, the daughter of Mary

I give and bequeath unto Rebecca Moore the daughter of Major A D  
Moore and her, Executors and Admors forever, a female slave  
called Hedy, the daughter of Mary

I give and bequeath unto Ann Moore the daughter of Major A D  
Moore and her, Executors and Admors forever, a female slave  
called Laura, the daughter of Mary

I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Watters Moore the daughter of  
Major A D Moore, and her, Executors and Admors forever, a female  
slave called Hedy, the daughter of Polly

I give and bequeath unto Catharine Sophia Moore the daughter of  
Major A D Moore and her, Executors and Admors forever, a female  
slave called Caroline the daughter of Polly

I give and bequeath unto my cousin Alexander Duncan Moore  
the son of Major A D Moore and his Executors and Admors forever,  
a male slave called Charley, the son of Mary

I give and bequeath unto James Moore the son of Major A D  
Moore and his Executors and Admors forever, a male slave called  
William the son of Polly

I give and bequeath unto Richard Linn Moore the son of Major  
A D Moore and his Executors and Admors forever, a male slave called  
Tom, the son of Pannilla

residue of my estate of every kind and denomination whatsoever  
both in possession and in action

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint the said Major A D  
Moore, sole executor of this my last Will and Testament

The fourteenth day of March 1743. William Reiley in the County  
 of New Hanover, Planter, being very sick and weak in body, but  
 of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God therefor  
 calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it  
 is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last  
 will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all  
 I give and recommend my soul to the hands of God that gave it,  
 and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Chris-  
 tian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but  
 at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty  
 power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it  
 hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise, and dispose  
 of the same in the following manner, and form  
 I give and bequeath to my son John Reiley, one plantation  
 lying upon the other side of the creek, joining to Art Long  
 and I give to my son Edward Reiley the plantation and land Art  
 Long, and he must give to his brother John Reiley thirty pounds sterling  
 and I give to my dearly beloved wife Mary Reiley this plantation to  
 live upon until her son Edward be of age  
 and I give to my two sons William Reiley and Bartholomew the three  
 negroes named berry, Ned and Merian, to be laid out to the  
 best advantage  
 and I give to my dearly beloved wife all the moveables
