

In the name of God Amen. Archibald Macclaine
of New Hanover, in New Hanover County, being of sound and disposing
mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament,
in manner following,

After payment of my funeral expenses, and my just debts, I give
and devise all my estate real and personal, to my son in law,
George Hooper, and my daughter, Catharine his wife, subject to the
bequests herein after, contained, to be disposed of or retained in
such manner, as they shall think proper for the benefit of themselves
and their children; nevertheless, upon this precedent condition and
subject thereto, that they or one of them pay unto my wife Elizabeth
Macclaine quarterly for her maintenance, during her natural life
a sum of money, not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars
in any one year, and accommodate her with a house or my place
station or such other place as may be deemed convenient for her,
and such servants as may be necessary for her in addition to
few which she will have in her own right by surviving me. It is
also my will and I do hereby direct that my said wife, shall have
during her life the use of so much of my household furniture as she
may have occasion to use, and I do give my said wife the said annuity
of two hundred and fifty dollars, with the use of a house servant, and
furniture, in lieu of dower, and all other claims she may have on my
estate after my death, and on condition, that she relinquish all such
claims, being as much as is justice to my daughter, and her children
I do afford to leave my said wife, and I trust what will be sufficient
for a decent and comfortable maintenance for her,

and I do hereby constitute and appoint, the said George Hooper, Cath-
arine Hooper, and my grandson Archibald Hooper to be executors
of this my last Will and Testament, all written with my own hand
hereby, revoking all wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty
sixth day of May, one thousand seven hundred and ninety,
