or in dollars at twelve shillings each—
and after my just debts are paid, I further give and devise unto
my beloved wife Margaret Beloit, her heirs or assigns, all my real
and personal estate whatsoever, to hold to her, the said Margaret
Beloit, her heirs and assigns forever—
and I do hereby appoint my said beloved wife Margaret Beloit
sole executrix of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all
former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal the eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and ninety five—

by the above named Cesar Augustus Beloit
to be his last will and Testament in the
