I, Bath Batson of Topsail Sound in the County of Hanover
N.C. do make and ordain this my last will and Testament,
in manner, and form following, viz.,
I leave to my wife Sarah the plantation on which I now live, with
all and every part of the household and kitchen furniture,
panning utensils &c, also all the negroes now belonging to me, horses,
cattle, hogs, and all other stock, for her use during her natural
life, at her death the property to be divided as follows,
To my daughter Nancy, I give and bequeath one negro woman
by the name of Jindea and her increase, one feather bed, one cow
and calf, to her, and heirs forever,
To my daughter Polly, I do leave for her natural life a negro girl by
the name of Samora after her decease to her daughter Martha
Anne Andrews, if she has no issue, to return to my son John
Batson and his heirs forever,
To my daughter Sarah, I do give and bequeath a negro girl
by the name of Elsey, one feather bed and furniture, one cow
and calf, to her, and her heirs forever,
To my son James Batson, I do give and bequeath this place where
I now live, to him and his heirs forever,
To my son John Batson, I do give and bequeath the land I bought of
James Howard, with the mill and all thereto belonging, also two
negroes by the name of Zinaman and Dorothy, also one feather
bed and furniture, to him and his heirs forever,
To my grandson William Batson, I do leave a negro boy by
the name of Peter, during his natural life; in case he has
issue, I do give and bequeath the said Peter, to it and his
heirs forever, and in case of his having no issue, to return to my
son John Batson and his heirs forever,
The balance of my property not mentioned in this will, at my
wife's decease to be sold and equally divided between my children.
I nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Sarah
and friend William B Seabury sole executors of this my last
will and Testament hereby revoking all other, and former, wills

by me at any time heretofore made. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 24th day of November AD 1839.

In the name of God Alme. I Edward Blivers of Wilmington, Merchant, being sick and weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be and contain my last Will and Testament in manner following, vizt.

First. This is my desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my dear mother, Diana Blivers, thirty pounds sterling money per annum during her life from that interest of my estate, to be remitted by half yearly payments, by my Executors herein mentioned, the first payment to be made in twelve months after my death.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth Cohen wife of Joseph Cohen of London, and to her heirs, fifty pounds sterling to be remitted by Bill of Exchange as soon after my death as my Executors conveniently can.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my niece the eldest daughter of my sister Elizabeth Cohen, one hundred pounds sterling to be paid her, when she arrives at the age of eighteen, or on the day of marriage, which shall first happen.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my brother Nathl Blivers, five hundred sterling money.

Item. I give, devise and bequeath unto my dear wife Peggy, her heirs and assigns forever, all my estate both real and personal that I shall be possessed of either, in Great Britain, the Province or elsewhere, (the legacies herein before bequeathed only excepted) and
