Be it remembered that I Benjamin

Larkins Senr, of the county and state aforesaid, planter, being at this time in good health and my mental faculties unimpaired, do make and ordain this instrument of writing, and for my last Will and Testament, that is to say,

First. I recommend my soul to my Creator, and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor, to be hereafter named; and as to my worldly estate and property will and bequeath to be disposed of as follows, viz,

I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Larkins Junr, in trust for my daughter, Rebecca Jane Lamb and her lawful heirs, a negro boy called Tom, which negro I wish to be an remain in the possession of my said daughter, Jane.

I also give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Larkins Junr, in trust for my daughter, Jane Jacobs and her heirs, a negro called Amy, and all of her children except a child called Sue, and what she may have after her death.

I also give and bequeath to my son in law William Lamb five dollars, and also give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Larkins Junr, in trust for my daughter Sarah Ann Rowle and lawful heirs, a negro woman called Sue, and her two children one called George and the other Mary Ann. I also wish it to be understood that my son Benjamin Larkins Junr is not to be considered to have any right or title to any of the above bequests, but only to be considered as trustee for the Legatees above mentioned.

I also give to my two sons Benjamin Larkins Jr and William Larkins a piece of land containing four hundred acres in the County aforesaid, which I have lately purchased from Samuel Larkins, the said land to be equally divided between them share and share alike. And I further give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Larkins Junr all my lands on the west side of Riley's creek, and also bequeath to my son William Larkins all my lands on east side of Riley's creek; this last bequest to my son William, not to take place till the death of my wife with whom I wish to remain until she may give up her right to said William by her consent.

And as to the rest of my property viz, negroes and stock of all kinds, household and kitchen furniture, plantation tools &c, it is my request the same be equally divided between my wife Susannah and my two sons that is Benjamin and William.

Now I hereby acknowledge this as and for my last Will and Testament, and do by these presents constitute and appoint my son Benjamin Larkins, and William Larkins son of Robert Larkins to be my executors to the same. In witness whereof I have hereunto set

 daughter Sarah Rose, a negro woman by the name of Tillery,
 an hei, daughter of Henry,
 I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Larkins, all my share
 of the Stock, household and kitchen furniture and plantation tools.
 I further, give to my son William R. Larkins, Five dollars.
 I also give to my son in law James Rose One dollar.

 seventeenth day of July A.D. One thousand, eight hundred and thirty
 three (1833).
