First - I give and devise all my estate both real and personal, whereof I have left to be equally divided, share, and share alike, between my wife Susan Ann, and my children, and the children of my deceased son Thomas J. Flanner, and my grand son Andrew Flanner, and in said division the children of said son son Thomas shall take but one share per Stirpes, and not per Capita, and further should my said grand son Andrew die without leaving a child or children his surviving thus my will is that the share of my estate desired to him shall be divided equally between my said wife, and my children then living, and such of their children as may be then living, the children of those who may be deceased to represent their parents and take per Stirpes, and not per Capita in the division of said share.

Second - I confirm the gift I have made to my said wife, and my daughter Mary C. Mayhue, and the same shall not be changed against them in the division of my estate.

Third - I appoint my two sons William B. and Charles Flanner executors of this my last will and testament.
