First. I give and bequeath to my dear wife Elizabeth Rochell, all my personal and real property in the State and County aforesaid.

Secondly. It is my wish that all my debts be paid, and after which, all such property as may be left, for her to have and to hold during life; and after my debts are paid, should there remain any of my personal property, it is my wish as above mentioned, for my children during their life; furthermore it is my desire and wish, that at her death, all such landed property as may be then left, to be equally divided among my dear children.

Do I hereby make and declare my worthy friend Jacob James Executor of this my last will and Testament.
