The Witnesses whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal, the tenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred, and sixty one

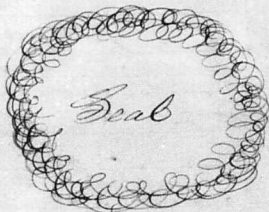
